## **MINISTRY MATTERS**

Dear UUCE Community Members & Friends,

It's a hard time in the world as I write this November newsletter article and my heart is heavy. I imagine yours is, too.

Our whole state of Maine is in shock and grieving after the mass shooting that took place in a bowling alley and restaurant in Lewiston, resulting in the tragic deaths of 18 people. Our sense of safety is shaken. The tragedy of gun violence in this country continues to spin out of control.

Earlier in the month, members of Hamas killed 1,400 unsuspecting Israeli civilians, taking 200+ people hostage, acts of horrific violence that have terrorized the whole county. Since then, retaliatory strikes by Israeli military forces against Hamas targets in Gaza are reported to have killed over 6,000 Palestinian civilians. With very little prospect of a cease fire and mounting casualties, a worsening humanitarian crisis in that region seems inevitable.

Deep breath.

Truth be told, I don't know what to say to be encouraging in the face of these and other tragedies. There's so much to grieve. There are no easy answers. It's understandable, expected even, that we'd feel overwhelmed, angry, sad, deeply concerned and worried about the state of the world and where we are headed.

At times like this, it's more important than ever that we take care of ourselves—body, mind and spirit— and that we find ways to turn toward each other. We do this, at least in part, by reaching out, by listening generously and lovingly to others, and by coming together in the ways we can to try and find the ground beneath our feet again. Part of the blessing and the work our UU spiritual community is to help each find ways back from despair to a more rooted sense of strength, resilience that helps us

to keep bearing witness to suffering, and to choose, again and again, to be a part of creating conditions in ourselves, our lives and the wider world around us that make peace and healing more possible.

Doing something generous, helpful, or kind for someone else in need, helps! Getting off our phones and computers and limiting the time we spend on social media, helps! ## 8<sup>TH</sup> PRINCIPLE NEWS

Assessment. Our congregation voted to approve the 8th Principle in May of 2022. That meant that we pledged to become a multicultural, beloved community; to become more welcoming of a diverse membership; and to hold ourselves accountable to do the work of anti-racism and anti-oppression. Our task force was charged with accompanying the congregation on this journey. But first, we had to figure out what this means in practice, where we are trying to go, and determine from where we are starting.

The Board of Directors approved the work of conducting an anti-racism assessment with all church committees and working groups and this effort was announced at the October congregational meeting.

In fact, the board itself just completed this assessment the end of October, and we've completed this work with PASA. We look forward to meeting with each church committee to conduct this assessment and to learn more about our understanding of where we are on our journey to dismantle racism and what kinds of activities and/or collaborations we could be planning in coming months.


Greetings UUCE Congregates and Families.

- 2. Click on the Event you want to attend.
- 3. In that box, click either on Zoom Link or on View Event. Both will take you to a new screen. If the event has not yet started, click on the blue Zoom link on that screen. If the event has started, you'll see We're Live on the right side of that screen, and with a click you'll be in the event.

#### TO ACCESS EVENTS ON THE APP:

- 1. Tap on the three-bar symbol on the top left of your screen.
- 2. Tap on Events, which will be on the top part of the screen.
- 3. You will see a list of all upcoming events. Within the box for the one in which you're interested tap on Zoom meeting, which is next to the blue Zoom icon.
- 4. You will be taken to another screen. Tap on Zoom meeting, which is at the bottom of this screen and you will be taken to your event.
- 5. You can also RSVP to events on this screen. Just tap on the one that applies (i.e., Going, Maybe or Not Going).
- 6. You can add the Event to your calendar from this screen, and you can access the Zoom link.

## HERE'S WHAT'S COMING UP IN NOVEMBER:

FULL DESCRIPTIONS OF ALL EVENTS IS AVAILABLE ON THE UUCE ZOOMERS SITE (UUCE-ZOOMERS.MN.CO)

- (Wednesday, October 25 and November 1, 4:00 6:00 PM), hosted by Amy Thompson. This 5-session series began on September 27 and concludes on November 1. You must have participated in the first event in order to participate in subsequent sessions.
- Coffee with ... Chuck Betancourt, our Director of Religious Exploration (Thursday, November 9 6:30 7:30 PM). The Coffee With... series is a monthly event in which we get to know our UUCE staff and lay leaders. We'll start with an interview with our guest by the host Mary Haynes and will then open up the discussion for comments and Q&A time.
- Let's Talk About God (Thursday, November 9, 3:00 – 4:00 PM), hosted **by Mary Haynes.** This is the last of a 3-part discussion. In this session we'll focus on the following topics: Is God a personal God or an impersonal force? If God is a personal force why don't more of us feel an identifiable connection with God? How would we go about strengthening that connection if we wanted to? Is God fallible? How might we reconcile scientific knowledge and achievements with the existence of God? If we believe in the existence of God are we simply gullible or inadequately informed? How do we utilize our concept of a good God to make a positive difference in the world? You are welcome to join us for this discussion even if

- you didn't attend the first session. If you'd like to take the God survey that was discussed in the first session, contact Mary Haynes (mhaynes@ roadrunner.com) and the survey will be sent to you. The survey is an exploration of your own views about God, there are no right or wrong answers, and it is submitted anonymously.
- Monthly Movie Night (Date and time TBA). The movie for November is Descendants, which is the story of the descendants of the last slave ship to arrive in the US (which took place after such ships were no longer legally allowed). This is the same movie that we tried unsuccessfully to air in August. We've figured how to share a movie now.
- Stitch and Chat (Monday, November 20, 3:00 4:00 PM), hosted by Marta Rieman. This is a monthly gathering (on the 3rd Monday of each month) of those who enjoy needlework to get together and chat while working on individual projects. It's an old-fashioned sewing circle with the modern update of taking place virtually.

## UNITARIAN UNIVERSALISM'S **6 SOURCES**

The living tradition which we share draws from many sources:

- Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life;
- 2. Words and deeds of prophetic people which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;
- 3. Wisdom from the world's religions which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;
- 4. Jewish and Christian teachings which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbors as ourselves;
- Humanist teachings which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science, and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;
- 6. Spiritual teachings of earth-centered traditions which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.
