Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. has taken a thought from Theodore Parker, transcendentalist and Unitarian minister, and made these words echo through the ages. In honor of Martin Luther King Day, the Justice Ministry will focus on this quotation, and whether the arc of the moral universe needs our active participation in order to pull it toward justice. These are challenging times and we will need to work together to foster justice in our communities and in our larger society. Let's plant the seeds of justice and tend the growth toward an equitable society in which all have value and the opportunity to flourish.

The Justice Ministry has grown out of our UUCE Peace and Social Action Ministry in response to our sense of the changed political environment since November. We have been meeting regularly to acknowledge our fears and concerns for our democracy and for the many community members who fall into one or more of several population groups whose rights may be threatened. We are working to live our faith and spiritual values into our world, identify areas in which we can actively work to foster justice, improve and protect the lives of underprivileged people, and speak up for our democratic ideals of and belief in justice for all.




