Rev. Benjamin Perry is the Editorial Director at Garrett Seminary and author of Cry, Baby: Why Our Tears Matter. An award-winning writer, his work has been featured in The Atlantic, TIME, The Washington Post, Teen Vogue, Slate, Religion News Service and more, and he has appeared on outlets like NPR, Vox, MSNBC, and The BBC. He was previously Minister of Outreach and Media Strategy at Middle Church in NYC, and now lives in Camden, Maine with his partner, the novelist E.K. Sathue. Rev. Perry is also a board member of OUTMaine, an award-winning queer theologian, and an experienced group facilitator.

Hello Congregants and Friends,

WELCOME BACK UUCE! This summer has been filled with trials and tribulations but as usual we are gathering back together and forging strong with our community around us. We are going to try some new things this coming church year as it comes to RE.

Firstly, we are expanding our class schedule to cover 3 RE classes in the months that have 4 weeks and 4 RE classes in the months that have 5. This has us having Religious Exploration every week of the month, 3 classes and 1 Multi-generational service or 4 classes and 1 Multi-generational service. These Multi-Gen services are just as important as the RE Classes themselves. For those of you who were able to attend, our August Multi-Generational service was The Science of Faith where Candace Hubbard and I fabricated a service around science. Experiments such as Elephant Toothpaste, Naked Eggs, and a Take Home Lava Lamp helped us to explain the theme that "Science is the movement forward of Society. By having the children participate in these services we are teaching them that they are an integral part of our church family and that we need them just as much as they need us. 
help this program not only grow into what it used to be before Covid but it will allow us to be able to surpass what we were into what the church has always wanted and needed.

Find what calls to you. What one thing will you do today?

- Call or email your representative about an issue that concerns you. Use the 5 Calls app or Resistbot to get started.
- · Write a **letter to the editor.**
- Attend a protest (such as the Labor Day event above)
- Attend online events and trainings. Some good ones are offered by Showing up for Racial Justice (surj.org) or the ACLU (aclu.org).
- Support a vulnerable community. Write letters to people in prison (WriteAPrisoner.com), join a rapid response network (ask Barb Acosta or Jana Robinson), or support the Cookie Ministry (ask Kay Wilkins).
- Make art and display it in public. Draw, paint, or write a colorful sign about your dreams, your hopes for a better world, or to celebrate something that you love about this one.
- Check in on a beloved, let them know they are loved and supported.
- **Find joy!** In times of oppression, Audre Lorde teaches us that choosing to find and express joy can be an act of resistance, challenging the status quo and affirming one's humanity. Got something to add to this list? Email JustUs425@proton.me.

COURAGEOUS CONVERSATIONS

in Community at UUCE This Fall!

Facilitator, Rev. Benjamin Perry & with other UUCE Members, Charles Betancourt, RE Coordinator & Rev. Sara

Rev. Perry returns to UUCE at the end of the month on **Sunday, September 28th** to lead worship and co-facilitate another building-the-muscle-of-practicing-covenant-together Congregational Conversation. We hope you'll plan to be there and actively participate in sharing and listening to each other as we name some of the challenges of becoming more conscious of the impacts of ageism & ableism in our congregation.

Rev. Perry will also lead worship and two more Congregational Conversations in October and November (see details below). We encourage you to put these dates on your calendar now! Even if you're not able to make it every time, we'd love you to be there for as many as possible. Remember, too, even if there's one issue particularly dear to your own heart, that's similarly true for fellow congregants and we need to show up for one another!

September 28 - Ageism and Ableism —

We're called to build church that welcomes all bodies, embracing differences in ability and where we find ourselves on life's journey. For this conversation, Rev. Perry will be joined by Cecily Judd as we reflect on how we may inadvertently put a stumbling block before people's full participation, or disregard the unique gifts that people bring. We'll also reflect on how we can improve our facilities to better welcome all who enter our doors!

October 12th – Race Matters – talk about it as allies

For this conversation, Rev. Perry will be joined by Rev. Vanessa Titang to co-facilitate discussion about how systemic racism manifests in our communities, and what we can do to build more just and loving communities. We'll talk about how whiteness shapes cultural and religious spaces, as well as our own emotionality, and reflect on how we can uproot these harmful legacies.

November 16 - Ecology and Poverty

In Maine, we're blessed with incredibly rich natural resources, but we also have stark gaps in access to food, education, and affordable housing. Together, we'll reflect on the rich abundance God calls us to share, and the ways we're falling short of that goal. We're thrilled that Rev. Perry co-facilitate a discussion on how UU Ellsworth can be part of the solution, using worship and community events to move us toward a more just future.
